These advantages also happen to be the negative aspects of the internet. This is because of the ease with which all kinds of information is available to a child. Thus, we can see that the internet has both positive and negative influence on the children. To increase the positive impact and minimise the negative effect, parents can play an active role. They should keep a check on the websites visited by the child during his or her internet sessions. Parents should have a good bonding with a child so that he or she does not hesitate to ask for parent's help if one falls victims to cyber bullies. The child should be made to realise that

the world of the internet is a virtual one. Internet is necessary as a source of information and communication but it cannot be substitute for real life, real relations and real friendship.
